When TCC South opened its doors in 1967 as the first campus of Tarrant County Junior College, its initial enrollment of 4,272 constituted the largest-ever opening enrollment for a junior college in the United States. The Campus also held the District's first official commencement ceremony, conferring degrees and certificates to 107 students. TCC South currently boasts an enrollment of more than 8,700 students.

Today, Tarrant County College District boasts six campuses and serves more than 100,000 students annually. Underscoring its commitment to the community, Tarrant County College works with businesses, community and economic workforce development organizations, and industry associations to develop the workforce Tarrant County needs to thrive and grow.




