TARRANT COUNTY COLLEGE

For 50 years, Tarrant County College (TCC), originally Tarrant County Junior College, has provided access to affordable post-secondary educational opportunities for individuals in the North Texas region. TCC's primary goal is to be a "student-ready" college that meets students where they are through offerings from literacy education and training to its highly acclaimed, accelerated Cornerstone Honors Program.

TCC differentiates itself from other area higher education institutions through its commitment to access and value.

Access: TCC enrolls more than 100,000 credit and non-credit students annually in 110 degree/certificate programs. There are six campuses within the College District, including a robust on-line "virtual" campus; multiple learning centers and, intensive workforce education programs that address the dynamic employment needs of area business and industry. TCC is the sixth-largest higher education institution in Texas and one of the 20 largest in the nation.

Value: Each year, one out of every 18 Tarrant County citizens enrolls in a course at TCC, and TCC ranks ninth in the nation for the total number of associate degrees awarded annually. Remarkably, 89 percent of TCC graduates remain, live and work in Tarrant County after graduation.

TCC FOUNDATION

The Tarrant County College Foundation raises philanthropic contributions and endowed funds in support of the students and programs of Tarrant County College. Nearly half of TCC's students are the first in their family to pursue a college education and have median annual household incomes of \$25,000. Through the establishment of scholarships and programs to assist TCC students, TCC Foundation helps to ensure that the region's next nurses, first responders, teachers, automotive technicians, welders, construction workers and managers, small business owners, computer programmers and aviation technicians have the financial resources needed to complete their training and education.

TCC's commitment to access to postsecondary learning, the success of students and its economic impact on our region are fueled by the College's ability to support students while in college and help others prepare for college through pre-collegiate afterschool and summer programs. TCC Foundation is governed by a board of directors consisting of individuals representing a cross-section of business and community leaders.
